The population of Casper, and Wyoming in general, is expected to grow, which will mean that crime will also rise.

"Casper had the fourth-highest murder rate in Wyoming in 2020, as well as the fifth-highest rate of sexual assault cases. Property crime is much more prevalent, with about five property crimes occurring each day in Casper" (Ilic, 2023).

According to (The Safest and Most Dangerous Places in Natrona, nd), "your chance of being a victim of crime in Natrona County may be as high as 1 in 16 in the northeast neighborhoods, or as low as 1 in 31 in the southwest part of the county."
